Upon graduation from the University of Maryland with a BS degree in Business Management I served four years in the US Navy as commissioned officer and naval aviator. After receiving an Honorable Discharge from the Navy I applied for and was accepted for a position as Special Agent with the FBI.

I started my training at the FBI Academy located in Quantico, Virginia in May 1973. Training lasted approximately 16 weeks and included intensive studies in Law, Administration, Forensics, Photography, Interview and Arrest Techniques, Defensive Tactics, Firearms and Report Writing.

After graduation from the FBI Academy I reported to my first office in Albany, NY, where I was assigned to investigate general criminal matters to include White Collar crime cases, Fugitive matters, Theft of Government Property and Bank Robberies. After one year in Albany I was transferred to the Washington Field Office and worked a variety of matters to include National Security investigations, Kidnapping and Extortion matters, Bank Robberies and Fugitives. I was detailed for two years to the Department of Justice to work as a bodyguard for the United States Attorney General.

Based on my background as a Naval Aviator I was chosen to perform as a Bureau Pilot in Command and flew several surveillance missions for the Baltimore Field Office. I also worked on National Security matters and undercover operations.

In 1984 I was promoted to the position of Supervisory Special Agent and transferred to FBI Headquarters in WDC to manage and oversee Special Operations for all Field Offices. I also served as a squad supervisor and Unit Chief prior to being promoted to Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the New York Field Office, where I managed the Special Operations Branch followed by the Violent Crimes Branch and lastly the Terrorism Branch.

I was promoted to the position of Special Agent in Charge of the Omaha Division. There I was put in charge of the Omaha Field Office and was responsible for all Bureau investigations in the states of Nebraska and Iowa.

I retired from the FBI in 1998 to take become the Vice President of Security for the Seagrams Liquor Company, (1998-2001) and later became the Director of Security for Cap Gemini Ernest and Young, (2001-2003).
